The other significant disruption to the schools normal functioning is of course the building programme. I can now give you all some tentative dates for this project but these are all subject to change due to weather or unforeseen issues along the way. Firstly, to outline the proposed work during the upcoming October holidays when the school will be completely closed for major works.

- The old dental clinic will be demolished. This building has been identified by the Council as being earthquake prone and cannot unfortunately be reinstated
- Repairs of minor works on the sliders and some fittings in the Kakano (Junior) block
- Water tightness work in the library (Currently Kakano 1)
- There are some other significant actions occurring these holidays that will also impact the school but until I am certain of these I will wait and let you all know in a 3rd September news update.

**The builders will be placing the new roofing system on the class blocks that border the netball courts and swimming pool. To do this they will need to extend the fencing out to allow space for the cranes to drop the roof on. They anticipate the playground to be disrupted for one week either starting 3rd September or 10th September, weather and product arrival depending.

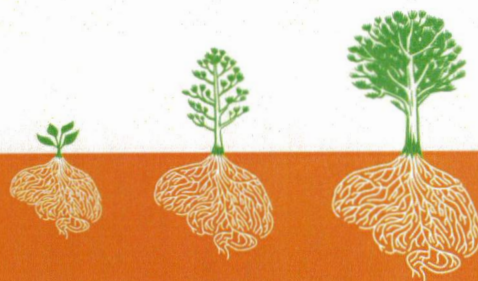
In this seminar our content will cover:
