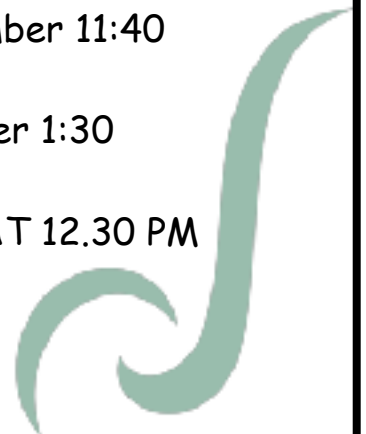
From the Principal

BUILDING UPDATE FROM WEDNESDAY 28 NOVEMBER TO
31 JANUARY 2019

- ★ New main courtyard to be completed mid next week
- ★ The staffroom is in use but obviously not accessible from the pathway
- ★ The school is totally inaccessible from December 14 as they carry out major civil works and any asbestos they may find in the admin blocks exterior walls as they re-clad it
- ★ THE total programme should be finished by February 13th 2019. We do anticipate some minor disruption at the start of the year but this should only be final touch ups and landscaping work.
- ★ Once the contractors have vacated the school we will survey the scene and start the process of putting our own personal touches on the environment. We know there are a number of jobs that need to be attended to around the school including raised concrete pads, asphalt lifting due to roots systems as well as a lot of painting and minor repairs. We will develop a plan going forward to complete this work and are very keen for any ideas you may have to be forwarded to me at any time.
